# **Prayer of Great Thanksgiving**

One: Let us eat and drink together for our strengthening in the faith and for the sake of the world. Christ is risen!

All: He is risen indeed!
One: Lift up your hearts

All: We lift them up to the Lord

One: Let us give thanks to our God

All: It is right to give our thanks and praise.

One: We praise you and thank you loving God......

..... You made covenants with your rebellious people over and over again, never completely losing patience with them no matter how hard they tested.

All: You heard the cries of your people as slaves, exiles, as outcasts, and each time you responded.

One: Your prophets, young and old, in ancient times and new have called us to listen with our hearts and proclaim your truth with our lives.

All: Sometimes we have done that. And sometimes not. Yet you have continued to love us.

One: And when we could not seem to understand you came to live among us, revealing your nature most fully in Jesus of Nazareth.

All: You lived our life, bringing healing and new life to a parched world

One: Jesus sat at table with those whom no one else would invite, touched the unclean, healed the sick, played with children, and proclaimed your unconditional love to all who would receive it.

All: Jesus called men and women as disciples to continue his work

One: When those in power were angered Jesus declared that even the stones would cry out, for your word of justice and truth will not be silenced.

All: Even when we put Jesus to death you raised him to new life, and in so doing invite us to share in that life, too.

One: You have shown us that nothing, not even death, can stop you from loving us. So it is that we join the song of all creation to proclaim your goodness:

All: Holy, holy, holy are you
God of power and might,
heaven and earth are filled with your glory
Hosanna in the highest!
Blessed is the one who comes in your name
Hosanna in the highest!

One: On this great day of celebration, we recall Jesus' instruction to his friends: He took bread, gave thanks, broke the bread, and offered it to them saying "Take eat; do this and remember me"

Then he took the cup, and said "Take drink; and remember me"

All: We remember Jesus' integrity unto death.
We celebrate the Easter hope of resurrection.
We remember the promise of compassion and justice.

One: God of Love, send your Holy Spirit upon us and what we do here, that we, and these gifts, touched by your Spirit, may be signs of life and love to each other, and to all the world. We gather these and all our prayers, thankful that we may turn to you and say the words Jesus taught us to pray saying:

"Our Eather/Methor, who art in beauty."

"Our Father/Mother, who art in heaven hallowed be thy name they kingdom come, thy will be done on earth as it is in heaven give us this day our daily brad And forgives us our trespasses as we forgive those who trespass against us And lead us not into temptation but deliver us from evil..."


For thine is the kingdom, and the power and the glory forever and ever Amen.
