**Lenten Liturgy** Brandon Johnston and Nathan Poole (six candles are lit, for the six Sundays in Lent)

Today is the first Sunday of Lent.

Lent is a time of spiritual reflection and spiritual practice. It is a time when we reflect on those things that may keep us from following God's path of love and peace.

Today we extinguish our first Lenten candle.

This candle represents anger – anger that lives within us, anger that exists in our world; anger that can lead to hatred and violence.

(first candle is extinguished)

As we move through our Lenten journey, may we remember that God's love and compassion is stronger than anger, and can transform our lives. Let us pray:

Holy One, you accept us for who we are and love us into who we can be. As we journey through this season of Lent, help us remember that your grace and presence is always with us - even in those shadow places of our lives. May our hearts reflect your loving kindness, and may our lives be channels of your peace. Amen.

Sing: "Take, O Take Me as I Am" (MV 85) sung twice
