Today is the first Sunday of Lent.

Lent is a time of reflection, when we reflect on those things that block us from following God's path of love and care for one another, and love and care for the world.

Today we extinguish our first Lenten candle. This candle represents anger – anger within us, anger that exists in our world, anger that can lead to hatred and violence.

(Candle is extinguished)

Trusting that God's love and compassion is stronger than the anger in our world, let us pray together:

Gracious God, We give thanks that you accept us for who we are, and love us into who we can be. Throughout this Lenten journey, help us remember that even in those shadow places of our lives, your grace and presence is always with us, always holding us close and nudging us forward. In Jesus' name we pray, Amen.

Sing: "Take, O take me as I am" (MV 85) sung twice Take, O take me as I am; summon out what I shall be: Set your seal upon my heart and live in me.

Prayer of Confession (unison)

Holy God, as we begin this journey of Lent, help us look in our hearts and be honest with ourselves. For those times we have followed the path of deception, help us change our direction. For those times we have not taken the feelings of others into account, give us sensitivity. THE TEACHING "The Sacrament of Baptism"

The sacrament of baptism proclaims and celebrates the grace of God.

By water and the Spirit, we are called, claimed and commissioned: we are called God's own, welcomed as children of God;

we are claimed by Christ, united with Christ, with one another and the Christian community of every time and place;

we are commissioned to Christ's ministry of love, peace and justice, and strengthened by the Holy Spirit for the work of the church in the world.

PROFESSION OF FAITH AND PROMISES

Do you believe in God, Source of love; in Jesus Christ, love incarnate; and in the Holy Spirit, love's power?

Parents/Godparents Respond: I DO, BY THE GRACE OF GOD.

Will you share your faith with your child, growing with him/her in faith, hope and love, encouraging him/her by your words and actions in the way of Jesus Christ?

Parents/Godparents Respond: I WILL, GOD BEING MY HELPER.

CONGREGATIONAL COMMITMENT (stand as you are able)

Let us pledge to these persons our support and care: AS A BAPTIZED AND BAPTIZING PEOPLE, WE COMMIT OURSELVES TO SUPPORT AND UPHOLD YOU WITHIN THE COMMUNITY OF FAITH.

AFFIRMATION OF FAITH, A NEW CREED

We are not alone; we live in God's world. We believe in God: who has created and is creating, who has come in Jesus, the Word made flesh, to reconcile and make new, who works in us and others by the Spirit.
