LENTEN LITURGY

Readers: Parker Smith and Gunner Smith

(two candles are lit before the service)

Today is the fifth Sunday of Lent.

Lent is a time of reflection, when we think about those things that block us from following God's path of loving and caring for one another, and for the world.

Today we extinguish our fifth Lenten candle. This candle represents envy – envy within us, envy that exists in our world, envy that limits our capacity for gratitude, open-heartedness and generosity of spirit.

(Candle is extinguished)

Trusting that God's love and compassion is stronger than the envy, pride and arrogance, fear, greed and anger in our world, let us pray:

Gracious God, We give thanks that you accept us for who we are, and love us into who we can be. Throughout this Lenten journey, help us remember that even in those shadow places of our lives, your grace and presence is always with us, holding us close and encouraging us into new ways of being and living. In Jesus' name we pray, Amen. Sing: MV 85 Take, O Take Me As I Am (sung twice; please remain seated) Take, O take me as I am; summon out what I shall be: Set your seal upon my heart and live in me.

PRAYER OF CONFESSION** (unison)

Oh Holy One, we yearn for your presence in our lives, yet turn away from you time and again. We want to serve others, but become obsessed with our own desires. We yearn for your Word to fill our emptiness, yet let it be silenced by the noise of our world. Our hearts are so often clogged with the foolishness of our lives, and struggle to beat in rhythm with your own.

In this silence, and in the depths of our hidden souls, be with us and make us whole, Steadfast Love. Write grace upon our hearts, so we might be more forgiving people; write mercy on our hearts, so we might become more welcoming people; write hospitality upon our hearts that we might become more like Jesus Christ, the one who came for all people, even us....

Nathan's Notes

Today's anthem is an ancient one- the original tune could date to the 4th century, but the text could be much older, possibly coming from the earliest Christian gatherings.

Ola Gjeilo is a Norwegian composer, and has found a niche in modern choral writing. This is one of his earliest pieces- while it may sound ancient in certain sections, the soaring lines and rich harmonies are very fresh.
