THE TEACHING "The Sacrament of Baptism"

The sacrament of baptism proclaims and celebrates the grace of God.

By water and the Spirit, we are called, claimed and commissioned:

we are called God's own, welcomed as children of God;

we are claimed by Christ, united with Christ, with one another and the Christian community of every time and place;

we are commissioned to Christ's ministry of love, peace and justice,

and strengthened by the Holy Spirit for the work of the church in the world.
