Lenten Liturgy (Shannon MacFarlane and Lynlee Wolstencroft) (Three candles are lit representing the three remaining Sundays in Lent)

Today is the fourth Sunday of Lent.

Lent is a time of reflection, when we think about those things that block us from following God's path of loving and caring for one another, and loving and caring for the world.

Today we extinguish our fourth Lenten candle. This candle represents pride and arrogance – pride and arrogance within us, pride and arrogance that exists in our world, pride and arrogance that hurts relationships, blinds us to the needs of others, and makes us fearful of being vulnerable or asking for help.

(Candle is extinguished)

Trusting that God's love and compassion is stronger than the pride and arrogance, fear, greed and anger in our world, let us pray:

Gracious God, We give thanks that you accept us for who we are, and that you love us into who we can be, all the days of our lives. Throughout this Lenten journey, help us remember that even in those shadow places of our lives, your grace and presence is always with us, always surrounding us, always holding us close and moving us forward. In Jesus' name we pray, Amen.
