THE TEACHING "The Sacrament of Baptism"

The sacrament of baptism proclaims and celebrates the grace of God. By water and the Spirit, we are called, claimed and commissioned: we are called God's own, welcomed as children of God; we are claimed by Christ, united with Christ, with one another and the Christian community of every time and place; we are commissioned to Christ's ministry of love, peace and justice, and strengthened by the Holy Spirit for the work of the church in the world.

PROFESSION OF FAITH AND PROMISES

Do you believe in God, Source of love; in Jesus Christ, love incarnate; and in the Holy Spirit, love's power?

Parents/Godparents/representative of church respond: I DO, BY THE GRACE OF GOD. Will you share your faith with your child, growing with her in faith, hope and love, encouraging her by your words and actions in the way of Jesus Christ?

Parents/Godparents/representative of church respond: I WILL, GOD BEING MY HELPER.

AFFIRMATION OF FAITH, A NEW CREED (VU 918)

We are not alone; we live in God's world. We believe in God: who has created and is creating, who has come in Jesus, the Word made flesh, to reconcile and make new, who works in us and others by the Spirit.

We trust in God. We are called to be the Church: to celebrate God's presence, to live with respect in Creation, to love and serve others, to seek justice and resist evil, to proclaim Jesus, crucified and risen, our judge and our hope.


